- Our average Progress 8 grade was 0.55
- KS2 Sats entry for this cohort was below national average.
- 59% students achieved Grade 4 and above in English & Mathematics.
- Students at UWS made significantly more progress than others nationally in: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, RE and Combined Science.










## GCSE Results 2023

- This year's results are superb and are testament to the outstanding resilience of our students, given the challenges they have faced.
- They have sustained the outstanding progress made by students at UWS in 2019 and 2022 (and during the school-assessed grades of 2020/21).
- The overall progress score put us in the top 13% nationally and the highest non-selective school in the area.
- We are delighted that as a result of this success, all of our students have been able to move onto their destination of choice.
- We are delighted that Progress in Mathematics put the school in the top 2% nationally as well as the top 13% for value added for all of the science department.
- On average, a UWS student will achieve well over half a grade higher than their targets across a range of subjects; a just reward for all of their hard work over the five years.
